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

35% reduction in use of red cells since implementation

£414K cost avoidance (based upon current cost of red cell unit)

Plasma 43% reduction Platelets 36% reduction

Significant impact on appropriate indications, but scope for improvement in terms of number of units administered (single unit transfusions are promoted)



Summary – benefits

Allows recording & documentation of an evidence-based reason/indication for transfusion

Challenges decision making – is this appropriate? is there an alternative?

Knowledgeable and empowered staff (training/competency assessment)

Supported staff (advisory service)

Reduces usage (activity monitoring)

Appropriate use (audit)
